**Monday:** Reading/Writing: Listen to Clark the Shark on Storyline Online at:

Kg and 1<sup>st</sup> graders: On a piece of paper, draw a picture of one thing that happened in the story. You can draw the main character, where the story takes place, or your favorite part.

2<sup>nd</sup> – 5<sup>th</sup> graders: Draw a picture of something that happens in the story. Then, write 2 sentences using the sentence starter: I (would/would not) want Clark for a friend because...

**Tuesday:** Math: Shark math

\*If you do not have a printer, please feel free to copy the problems on paper, or choose an activity from the choice board.

From the folder, print the sheet that is for your grade/ability level, or copy the problems on a piece of paper.

**Wednesday:** Social Studies: We have talked about why rules are important. Remember that rules are in place to keep you safe! Think of some of the rules that Clark broke in the story.

Kg and 1<sup>st</sup> graders: Draw a picture of you following a rule in your house or classroom. This might be things like using walking feet, using kind words, not going outside without an adult, etc.

2<sup>nd</sup> – 5<sup>th</sup> graders: Take a piece of paper and fold it in half. On one side write 3 rules from school and on the other side right 3 rules you have in your home.

**Thursday:** Science: Visit [www.earthcam.com](http://www.earthcam.com) and type in sharks in the search box. Choose a live webcam to watch (it's very cool!). Next, draw a picture of what you see – types of animals, plants, etc.

If you do not have internet access, on a piece of paper, draw at least 5 animals or plants that live in the ocean.

**Friday:** Art: Take a white envelope and color it grey. Next, cut a triangle from one short edge of the envelope to make a mouth. Tape or glue the triangle to the top as a fin. Cut a row of triangles out of white paper to make teeth and glue them inside the mouth. Draw a fin on the side and use the black marker or crayon to draw an eye and details. Trim the edge of the envelope opposite the mouth, making an opening for your hand. Put your hand in the envelope to make the shark move.
