

# This week's theme is Butterflies!

**Monday:** Reading/Writing: Go to Bookflix.com and enter the username and password. Mrs. Sherman will post the password on ClassDojo or you may email me for it. In the search bar type in Butterflies and click on the 3<sup>rd</sup> option that pops up. Listen to the 2 stories about Butterflies called "Waiting for Wings" and "Butterflies".

Kg and 1<sup>st</sup> graders: On a piece of paper, draw a picture of what our caterpillars looked like on Friday on our Zoom call. Write the words **egg** and **caterpillar** on your paper.

2<sup>nd</sup> – 5<sup>th</sup> graders: After seeing the caterpillars on our Zoom call on Friday, write 2 sentences about what you saw and what you think will happen next. Then draw a picture.

## Tuesday: Math: Butterfly Math

Kg and 1<sup>st</sup> graders: Go on a butterfly number walk. Using the example on the right, draw a butterfly with a number 1-10 and the same number of dots on each sheet of paper. Go on a number walk using music. When the music stops, tell your parent or sibling the number and/or color you are standing on.



2<sup>nd</sup> graders: Beautiful Butterflies single digit addition sheet. If you do not have a printer, please copy the problems on paper or a dry erase board.

3<sup>rd</sup> – 5<sup>th</sup> graders: Beautiful Butterflies double digit addition sheet. If you do not have a printer, please copy the problems on paper or a dry erase board.

**Wednesday:** Science: Visit the [Chrysalis cam at the Florida Museum](#) and watch the butterflies and see the chrysalises. Next, draw a picture of what you see.

If you do not have internet access, on a piece of paper, draw what happens in the life cycle of a butterfly.

## Thursday: Art: Life Cycle of a Butterfly

You will need: Paper plate, glue or tape, black marker, leaf, dry beans, small stick, noodles (1 spiral, 1 bowtie, 1 shell - you may draw them if you do not have the noodles).
